

Awards and Certificates

Worked All States - LH (WAS-LH)

The Worked All States-Lighthouse award is issued for working and confirming lighthouse stations in all states that have lighthouses (31).

Worked All Continents - LH (WAC-LH)

The Worked All Continents-Lighthouse award is issued for working and confirming a lighthouse station on all six continents.

Worked All Call Areas - LH (WACA-LH)

The Worked All Call Areas-Lighthouse award is issued for working and confirming a lighthouse station in all ten US call areas.

DX-LH

Issued for working and confirming a lighthouse in at least 100 or more countries. The basic award is issued for 25 countries with endorsements by 25 until all 100 are worked.

Lighthouse Award

This is a certificate for any licensed amateur for submitting verifications for lighthouse contacts with 25 different lighthouses worldwide

Member Award

Available to any radio amateur who submits log extracts showing two-way communications with 25 members of the ARLHS.

Activator Award

Issued to those who set up a ham station on 10 or more lighthouses or lightships and establish contact with at least two other stations from each.

Operating Events

SL — The **Spring Lites QSO Party** is

held each year in April. This event welcomes spring with an event that provides awards and certificates to all those who work 25 or more lighthouses or lightships or 50 ARLHS members. Participants in the event are *not* required to operate from a lighthouse.

NLLW — The **National Lighthouse-**

Lightship Weekend coincides with the United States' *National Lighthouse Weekend*. This special event is usually held each year during the first weekend in August.

ILLW — The **International Lighthouse/**

Lightship Weekend is a world-wide special event that has several thousand participants each year. In year 2000 there were over 400 stations in more than 40 countries operating from lighthouses, and many thousands more working them from their home QTH. The event is held at the end of August each year.

LCL — Chase those winter blues and work

the **Lighthouse Christmas Lights QSO Party!** It is held during the winter holidays from the end of December through the beginning of January. Special certificates and awards are available for working members and lighthouses.

All modes and frequencies are used, but the following tend to be the most popular:

SSB: 1970, 3970, 7270, 14.270, 21.370, 28.370

CW: 1830, 3530, 7030, 14.030, 21.030, 28.030

To aid in preserving those lights in danger of destruction or decay

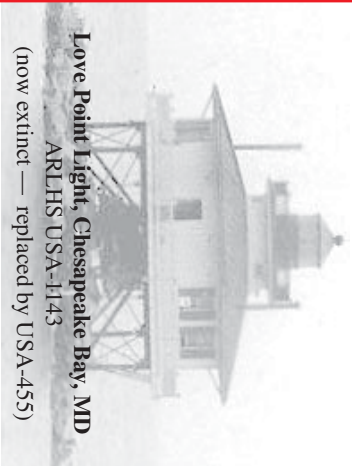
To recognize the keepers of the lights as maritime heroes
